EVENING HIGH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Five absences are allowed for a full credit Evening High School course for any reason. Three absences are allowed for a half credit course. If a student exceeds these limits he/she will be dropped from the course.

COUNSELING SERVICES

Guidance counselors are available each night to advise any member of the community regarding his/her educational or occupational opportunities.

EVENING HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIC COURSES ARE LISTED BELOW.
EVENING HIGH SCHOOL APPLICATIONS ARE REQUIRED AND CAN BE OBTAINED
FROM YOUR GUIDANCE OFFICE.

RESIDENTS - \$20.00 per one credit course, \$10.00 per half credit course.

Courses are offered for two nights a week, fourteen weeks, for three hours and twenty minutes each session. Thus, ninety (90) hours of instruction completes full course requirements in one semester. The Evening High School provides opportunities for students in day school to take additional courses for early graduation or to meet college requirements. It also gives students who are out of school an opportunity to complete diploma requirements.

You must be 16 years of age to attend Evening High School.
